This record fixes the point of diversion at one mile from the mouth of Watson Bar Creek. As it would be impossible to irrigate land on the reserve from an intake situated at this point, it was proposed to locate an intake at a suitable point further upstream, and by utilizing an old mining ditch, to obtain an economical irrigation system to the reserve.

Upon investigation it was found that the intake of the old mining ditch referred to, is not from Watson Bar Creek as was supposed but is located on a tributary of Watson Bar Creek, known locally as Red Creek. The distance from this intake to the reserve is approximately 5½ miles.

To obtain water from Watson Bar Creek it would be necessary to locate an intake at a considerable distance beyond Red Creek which is the logical source of supply to be considered. The Record is therefore of no value.

Note:- The estimated cost of repairing the old mining ditch from Red Creek to the Reserve is \$8,200.00 and as there is approximately 100 acres of irrigable land, the capital cost per acre irrigated would be about \$82.00. There are no means of transportation for getting produce from the reserve to a market and it would seem that an expenditure of \$82.00 per acre for irrigation is not justified under present conditions.
