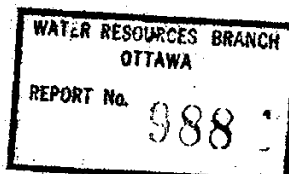

Remarks

Claims to water rights under the above record were officially abandoned for the following reasons:-

This reserve is not in the "Dry Belt" and the necessity for irrigation, at any time in the future, is very doubtful. Should it ever become necessary to resort to irrigation, a more suitable source of supply would appear to be Emory Creek on account of its proximity to the reserve. In any case there is an ample flow of water available in both streams and there should be no difficulty in obtaining a licence if and when required.

The record was subsequently cancelled under Board Order No. 5427.

Remarks No plans have been prepared for the irrigation of the small irrigable area on this reserve for the reason that it is doubtful if irrigation is necessary in this locality excepting during unusually dry seasons. Furthermore the stream referred to as Skawayluk Creek has not been identified and no stream was found near enough to the reserve to warrant consideration of an irrigation system for the benefit of so small an area.

The record was officially abandoned November 23rd, 1925, and was subsequently cancelled under Board Order No. 5445.

Upon investigation it was found that the intake of the old mining ditch referred to, is not from Watson Bar Creek as was supposed but is located on a tributary of Watson Bar Creek, known locally as Red Creek. The distance from this intake to the reserve is approximately 5½ miles.

To obtain water from Watson Bar Creek it would be necessary to locate an intake at a considerable distance beyond Red Creek which is the logical source of supply to be considered. The Record is therefore of no value.

Note:- The estimated cost of repairing the old mining ditch from Red Creek to the Reserve is \$8,200.00 and as there is approximately 100 acres of irrigable land, the capital cost per acre irrigated would be about \$82.00. There are no means of transportation for getting produce from the reserve to a market and it would seem that an expenditure of \$82.00 per acre for irrigation is not justified under present conditions.
