



CHAPTER 77.

An Act to authorize the Sale to the Canadian Northern Pacific Railway Company of a Portion of the Former Songhees Indian Reserve.

[Assented to 29th March, 1919.]

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, enacts as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Songhees Indian Reserve Sale short title. Act, 1919."

2. It shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor in Council to sell and grant to the Canadian Northern Pacific Railway Company, its successors and assigns, for railway purposes only, a portion of the former Songhees Indian Reserve, situate in the City of Victoria, of approximately twenty-six and forty-two one-hundredths acres in area, and according to a survey and description thereof to be agreed on at the time of sale, at the price of eight thousand five hundred dollars per acre, and upon such other terms as the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may approve.

Power to grant lands to C.N.P. Railway Company.
