VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, &c., &c., &c.

To all to whom these presents shall come, or whom the same may in anywise concern, Greeting:

#### A PROCLAMATION.

WE WHEREAS it is, in and by section thirteen of the Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in the session thereof, held in the forty-third year of Our Reign, chaptered twenty-five, and called and known as "The North-West Territories Act, 1880," in effect enacted, that the Governor in Council may, by proclamation, from time to time, direct that any Act of the Parliament of Canada, or any part or parts thereof, or any one or more of the sections of any such Act, shall be in force in the North West Territories generally, or any part or parts thereof, to be mentioned in the said Proclamation for such purposes;

And whereas an order of Our Governor in Council was passed on the seventeenth day of July in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, ordering and directing that the Act of the Parliament of Canada, passed in the session thereof held in the forty-fourth year of Our Reign, chaptered twenty-six, and intitled "An Act to prescribe a declaration to be taken by employees on telegraph lines under the control of the Government, and to

force, that is to say: That Frederick Montizambert, M.D., Medical Superintendent, Grosse Isle, Que., William N. Wickwire, M.D., Inspecting Physician, Halifax, N.S., William S. Gauvreau, M.D., Inspecting Physician, Rimouski, Que., be appointed Justices of the Peace within their respective Quarantine Stations, under the Act first above cited, and the persons hereinbefore named are hereby appointed Justices of the Peace within their respective Quarantine Stations.

And We do hereby command all Our loving subjects and all others whom these presents concern, that they do take notice of and obey the said regulation so made as aforesaid, and govern themselves accordingly.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. WITNESS, Our Right Trusty and Entirely Beloved Cousin the Most Honourable Sir HENRY CHARLES KEITH PETTY-FITZMAURICE, Marquis of Lansdowne, in the County of Somerset, Earl of Wycombe, of Chipping Wycombe, in the County of Bucks, Viscount Calne and Calnstone, in the County of Wilts, and Lord Wycombe, Baron of Chipping Wycombe, in the County of Bucks, in the Peerage of Great Britain; Earl of Kerry and Earl of Shelburne, Viscount Clanmaurice and Fitzmaurice, Baron of Kerry, Lixnaw, and Dunkerron, in the Peerage of Ireland; Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor General of Canada, and Vice Admiral of the same.

At Our Government House, in Our CITY of OTTAWA, this SEVENTEENTH day of JUNE, in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and in the Forty-eighth year of Our Reign.

## ORDERS IN COUNCIL

GOVERNMENT HOUSE, OTTAWA.

Thursday, the 16th day of July, 1885.

PRESENT:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR GENERAL  
IN COUNCIL.

ON the recommendation of the Honorable the Acting Minister of the Interior and under the provisions of the 4th sub-section of the 11th section of the Act passed in the Session of the Parliament of Canada, held in the forty-seventh year of Her Majesty's Reign, chapter six, and intitled "An Act respecting the Vancouver Island Railway, the Esquimalt Graving Dock and certain Railway lands of the Province of British Columbia, granted to the Dominion."

His Excellency, by and with the advice of the Queen's Privy Council for Canada, has been pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations for the survey, administration and disposal of Dominion Lands within the Railway Belt, in the Province of British Columbia, approved and adopted by the Governor in Council dated 20th of April, 1885, be and the same are hereby amended as follows:—

That clause 39 of said Regulations be rescinded and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

"39. That the provisions of the Act of the Legislature of British Columbia, 47 Vic., chap. 32, intituled "An Act relating to the cutting of timber upon Provincial lands and for the purpose of deriving a revenue therefrom," shall govern the mode of disposal and the rents, royalties, dues and charges upon the timber lands in the Railway Belt in British Columbia lying south of 49° 34' North Latitude and west of the 121° of Longitude West of Greenwich, but the said Act of the Legislature of British Columbia in so far as it applies to the lands in the Railway Belt lying south of 49° 34' North Latitude and west of the 121° of Longitude West of Greenwich shall be administered by the Minister of the Interior of Canada, and the rents, royalties, dues and other charges to be made and collected upon or in respect of the said timber lands shall be paid to the credit of the Receiver General of Canada, and the enactments and provisions in the twenty-six next following clauses shall be limited in their effect to the Dominion Lands in the Railway Belt in British Columbia, lying north and east of the tract hereinbefore described, as far as the 120° of Longitude West of Greenwich, and in regard to the timbered lands within the Railway Belt in British Columbia lying east of the said 120° of Longitude West of Greenwich, the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act, 1883, and the Regulations thereunder made from time to time by the Governor in Council, shall apply;

"(a) The word "timber" shall mean all wood and the products thereof."

His Excellency, by and with the advice of the Queen's Privy Council for Canada, has been pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered that the regulations for the survey, administration and disposal of Dominion Lands within the Railway Belt in the Province of British Columbia, approved by Order in Council dated 20th April, 1885, and amended by Order in Council of the 16th July instant, be and the same are hereby further amended as follows, that is to say:—

That the word "six" be substituted for the word "five" in the last line of clause 12 of said Regulation;

That sub-clause 4 of clause 20 be repealed, and that sub-clause 5 of the same clause be amended by striking out the words "Erection of a habitable house and cultivation."
