

CHAPTER 76.

An Act to amend the "Boldiers Land Act."

[assemica to which March, 1910.]

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Produce of Brobsh Colombia, eracts as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited at the "Soldiers' Land Act Amendment short title. Act, 1919."
- 2. Section 5 of the "Soldiers' Land Act," being chapter 80 of Re-cracts s z. the Statutes of 1918, is repealed, and the following is substituted therefor:—
- "5. It shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor in Council to:-
 - "(a.) Survey, resurvey, and subdivide any of the lands referred to in sections 3 or 4 of this Act into such areas as may be deemed expedient, and to erect, execute, and carry on all undertakings and works necessary or conducive to the improvement and fitting of the lands for occupation and use:
 - "(b.) Lease or grant, on such terms and conditions as may be deemed advisable, to any soldier or person other than a soldier, or to any community of persons composed wholly or in part of soldiers, one or more of such subdivisions, but, except where the lands are suitable for pastoral purposes only, not exceeding in the aggregate one hundred and sixty acres to each soldier or person:
 - "(c.) Convey, on such terms and conditions as may be decided advisable, to His Majesty in right of the Dominion on to any person, on request of the Dominion Government any lands referred to in sections 3 or 4 of this Act for

appointed by the Dominion Government to settle soldiers or settlers (within the meaning of section 2 of this Act, or within the meaning of any Act of the Dominion dealing with soldier settlement) in British Columbia:

- "(d.) Make, alter, amend, or repeal and remake rules and regulations for the better carrying-out of this Act according to its true intent and purpose:
- "(c.) Pay from any moneys appropriated by the Legislature for that purpose the costs of the erection, execution, and carrying-on of all undertakings and works erected, executed, or carried on under the provisions of clause (a) of this section; and pay from the Consolidated Revenue Fund, in addition to the amounts so appropriated and the amount mentioned in section 4, such costs as are necessary and incidental to the carrying-out of the provisions of this Act."
