

Claim to water from O'Keefe's (Meadow, Therm or Otter) Creek was officially abandoned on November 23, 1925, and subsequently cancelled under B.O. 3856. It was found impossible to obtain a gravity supply of water from this source owing to the very slight fall between Otter Lake and Okanagan Lake.

Several miles of ditch would be required with Right-of-Way through valuable lands. Such a system would not serve the bench land, where water is most needed, and the low-land, being sub-irrigated to a large extent, does not warrant the consideration of such a costly system at this time.

Should irrigation from the Similkameen River be contemplated at any time in the future there would be no difficulty in obtaining a record. Priority is of no importance whatever.

The Provincial Record of 30th January, 1897, for 100 inches from the Similkameen River was cancelled under Board Order No. 1568.
