Fort Victoria February 16th 1859

Sir/

In accordance with your request and with reference to a former letter on the same subject, we have now the honor to lay before your Excellency a statement of claims in British Columbia on the part of the Hudson's Bay Company to lands now and recently occupied by them.

We confine ourselves to the statement herewith enclosed, reserving for another occasion, if need be, a more detailed exposition of the grounds upon which our claims are founded knowing that your Excellency is already acquainted with the subject in all its bearing.

Her Majesty's Government in expressing a wish as they have done, to meet our claims in a liberal spirit are no doubt well aware that to the Hudson's Bay Company alone, do they owe the present possession and occupation of the vast territory in the portion of North America which embraces not only British Columbia but Vancouver's Island and its dependencies. Your Excellency is also aware of the more recent claims of the Company for direct and indirect services rendered to Her

Majesty's

Majesty's Government during the late trying crisis, since the gold discoveries. Through the instrumentality of the Company's Officers and resources, already forming the nucleus of a Government of which Your Excellency formed the head, the foundation of a great Colony has been successfully laid - Though the connexion be now severed, we need hardly add that our best services and influence shall be always at your Excellency's disposal, in the prosecution of the arduous task now before you.

We would only further recall to your Excellency's recollection the fact that our claims of occupation were acknowledged and recognized by both Her Majesty's Government and that of the United States of North America, and our rights confirmed on the cession of our territories in Oregon to the latter by the treaty of 1846.
