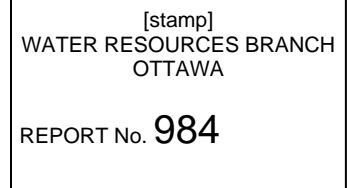


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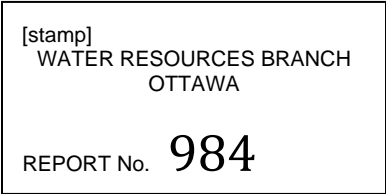

Allowed under the "Indian Water Claims Act". Licence will issue for 24 acre feet of water per annum for irrigation and 500 gallons a day for domestic purposes.</p>
<u>Conditional Licences.</u>	C.L. 6657 taking precedence from 2nd May, 1889, issued under B.O. 4529 in accordance with findings.
<u>Remarks</u>	The above licence provides for the irrigation of all the irrigable land on the reserve which can be irrigated from the small stream recorded.

Remarks

Allotments 2, 3 and 4 were filed with John Clapperton, Esq., Government Agent at Nicola, on 29th December, 1888, for record and published in the B.C. Gazette of 2nd May, 1889.

The Indians have the prior right to the water of Spahomin Creek which carries sufficient water to irrigate all the land which the Indians are likely to irrigate from this source.

<u>Remarks</u>	The above licence provides for the irrigation of all the irrigable land on the reserve, subject to prior rights of Upper Nicola I.R. No. 3.

<u>Claimed</u>	I.R.C. Allotments-- (1)--5 Sept. 1878--300 inches from Mameet River (Guichon Creek). (2)--5 Sept. 1878--100 inches from Mameet Stream for the reserves in the Nicola Valley. (3)--15 Sept. 1878--800 inches from Guichon Creek. (4)--15 Sept. 1878--200 inches from Lower Nicola River.

(1) Claim under an entry in the "Schedule of Indian Reserves 1913" for water out of Guichon Creek for use on Nicola-Mameet Reserve (No. 1 Lower Nicola). Disallowed on the ground that it is not based upon a Provincial Water Record nor upon an "In- dian Water Claim," under the "Indian Water Claims Act". (2) (File 27-5-1). Claim under Indian Water Claims Act for water out of Guichon Creek for use on Reserves in Nicola Valley between Naaik and Shackan. Disallowed on the ground that sufficient water from this source has been allowed under File 25-5-1 for Nicola-Mameet Reserve and that it is im- possible to take water from Guichon Creek to any other reserve in the Valley. (3) (File 25-5-1). Allowed under Indian Water claims Act. Licence will issue for 2250 acre feet of water per annum for irrigation and 15,000 gallons a day for domestic purposes. With the proviso that no more land below the wagon road shall be irrigated from Guichon Creek then is now under irrigation from this source. (4) (File 24-5-1). Allowed under Indian Water claims Act. Licence will issue for 1140 acre feet of water per annum for irrigation and 15,000 gallons a day for domestic purposes.

Remarks

Claim to water from Nicola River was official abandoned November 23rd, 1925, and was subsequently cancelled under B.O. 4754. This action was taken because the low lying land adjacent to the Nicola River is largely sub-irrigated from that source, and portions are inundated during the period of high water. An irrigation supply from the Nicola River does not appear to be necessary at present but should it become necessary to tap this source in future there is an ample flow available and a record could be easily acquired.

Storage works at the outlet of Mamette Lake were constructed and are to be maintained and used jointly with other interested users under an agreement dated 9th August, 1923.

The above licences provide for the irrigation of all the irrigable land on the reserve.

<u>Conditional Licence.</u>	C.L. 6654 taking precedence from 2nd May, 1889, issued under B.O. 4525 in accordance with findings. <u>Source</u> ---Gody Creek and Ainsworth Spring <u>Priority</u> --21st June, 1923. <u>Quantity</u> --Irrigation-235 acre feet per annum. Domestic---2000 gallons a day. <u>Land</u> -----96 acres.
<u>Remarks</u>	The I.R.C. Allotment was filed for record with John Clapperton, Esq., Provincial Government Agent at Nicola on 29th December, 1888 and published in the B.C. Gazette 2nd May, 1889. C.L. 6654 provides for the irrigation of 54 acres. The remainder of the irrigable area comprising 96 acres is provided for by C.L. 7242. Not in Railway Belt.

Claim under an entry in the "Schedule of Indian Reserves 1913" for water out of Meadow or Pipseul Creek for use on Pip- seul Reserve (No. 3 Lower Nicola). Dis- allowed on the ground that it is not based upon a Provincial Water Record nor upon an "Indian Water Claim" under the "Indian Water Claims Act".
<u>Conditional Licence.</u>	C.L. 7240 issued on application of the Indian Agent. <u>Source</u> ---Guichon and Meadow Creeks. <u>Priority</u> --21st June, 1923. <u>Quantity</u> --Irrigation-100 acre feet per annum. Domestic---1000 gallons a day. <u>Land</u> -----50 acres at 2 acre feet per acre.
<u>Remarks</u>	Claim to water under the I.R.C. Allotment 5th September, 1878, was disallowed pres- umably in error. This reserve is in the Railway Belt and could not come under the Indian Water Claims Act. New rights have been acquired under C.L. 7240 to provide for irrigation requirements.

Licence will issue for 415 acre feet of water per annum for irrigation and 2500 gallons a day for domestic pur- poses.
<u>Conditional Licence.</u>	C.L. 6651 taking precedence from 2nd May, 1889, issued under B.O. 1261 in accordance with findings.
<u>Remarks</u>	Allotment of 200 inches from Clapperton Creek was filed for record with John Clapperton, Esq., Provincial Government Agent at Nicola, on 29th December, 1888, and published in the B.C. Gazette 2nd May, 1889. The above licence provides for the irriga- tion of all the irrigable land on the res- erve, subject to prior rights. For prior rights see Water Records Report No. 2, page 15. Not in Railway Belt.

160 acres).

Claimed I.R.C. Allotment 15th September, 1878--

<u>Conditional Licence.</u>	C.L. 6646 taking precedence from 2nd May, 1889, issued under B.O. 3715 in accordance with findings.
<u>Remarks</u>	Allotment of 12th September, 1878, was filed for record with John Clapperton, Esq., Provincial Government Agent at Nicola, on 29th December, 1888, and published in the B.C. Gazette 2nd May, 1889. The above licence provides for the irrigation of all the irrigable land on the reserve subject to prior rights.

Not in Railway Belt.
